REPORT/CONTEXT

A design has been developed for the upgrade of the intersection of Boondilla Road and Gosford Avenue, The Entrance. The proposed upgrade includes formalisation of the intersection with a Stop restriction to be installed on Gosford Avenue, and the provision of pedestrian facilities with associated line marking and sign posting on Boondilla Road and Gosford Avenue.

As part of these upgrade works, it is proposed to install two pedestrian refuges with associated pram ramps; BB centre line marking; E5 edge line marking; a Stop restriction on the northern leg of Gosford Avenue; C3 No stopping line marking and No Stopping sign posting.

Council has undertaken consultation with surrounding residents and received no objections to the proposed changes.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The cost for the installation of the line marking and sign posting will be accommodated within the project budget.

DISCUSSION

Council officers presented an overview of the proposed road improvements to be installed as part of The Entrance District Development Contributions Plan. The project involves the provision of pedestrian refuges which complement the existing refuge on Gosford Avenue and will assist with regulating turning movements through the intersection. The No Stopping sign posting and line marking is consistent with Council's standard drawings for pedestrian refuges. Council officers confirmed that the design vehicle used was 12.5m in length, giving consideration to larger vehicles such as buses and waste collection vehicles.

Committee member representing Transport for NSW sought further information via email regarding the lane widths on Boondilla Road to the east of the intersection in relation to the provision of sufficient width for the through travel lanes if vehicles are parked against the kerb. Council officers advised that proposed widths are 5.5m for the eastbound lane, and 5.7m for the westbound lane. Additional lane width may be provided through adjustments to the E5 line marking to narrow the painted median.


Committee members will adopt the recommendations with modification to BB and E5 line marking on Boondilla Road.

RECOMMENDATION

- A The installation of BB centre line and E5 edge line on Boondilla Road and Gosford Avenue, The Entrance, with modification to the BB and E5 line marking on Boondilla Road, as shown on the plan in Attachment 1 is endorsed by the Committee.
- B The installation of a Stop restriction and associated sign posting and line marking on the northern leg of Gosford Avenue, The Entrance as shown on the plan in Attachment 1 is endorsed by the Committee.
- C The installation of No Stopping restriction and associated sign posting and C3 line marking in Boondilla Road and Gosford Avenue, The Entrance as shown on the plan in Attachment 1 is endorsed by the Committee.

6 General Business

Committee member representing Busways raised the following matters:

Gosford Public School – Following discussions at the previous Local Traffic Committee meeting, a
proposal to relocate the bus pick up/drop off area from Faunce Street West to Racecourse Road is
being investigated. This will require liaison with all relevant stakeholders including Department of
Education, Gosford Public School, Henry Kendall High School, NSW Police, Council and the bus
companies.

Council officers advised that it is important to consider how many buses will be operating in the area in order to determine the length of the bus zone required. Red Bus Services advised they currently have 4 buses in 15 minutes for Gosford Primary School, some of which conflict with Busways services. A separate meeting will be arranged with the bus companies to discuss arrangements on Racecourse Road.

Committee member representing Member for The Entrance raised the following matters:

- Recreational vehicles parking at Beach Street and Marine Parade, The Entrance Residents have raised issues with large recreational vehicles parking near the intersection of Beach Street and Marine Parade obscuring sight distance for motorists and pedestrians. Council has advised that it is permissible to park vehicles under 7.5m in length, in accordance with NSW Road Rules. Council will investigate improving delineation of the 40 km/h High Pedestrian Activity Area through additional signage and pavement stencilling.
- Shared pathway, Magenta A request has been made from residents of Magenta for the provision of
 pedestrian links across Wilfred Barrett Drive to the shared pathway currently under construction.
 Council officers will liaise with TfNSW and Council's internal project team for further investigation
 regarding the request.
