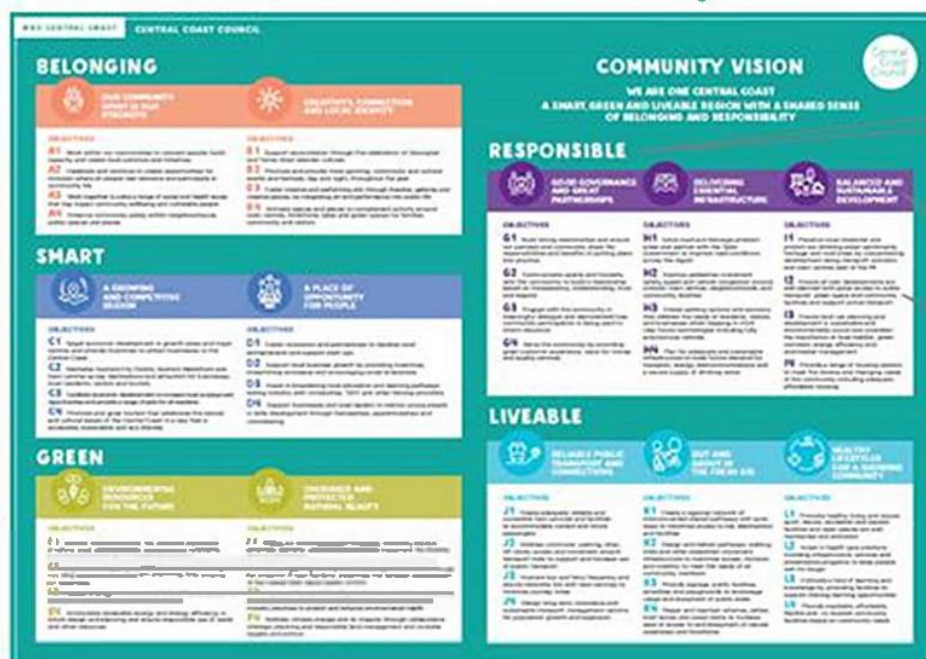

2.1 Shared Pathways - Priority Recreational Routes

Presentation by Jeanette Williams, Unit Manager Engineering Services, providing an outline on the Priority Recreational Route shared pathways being NSW Coastline Cycleway Link; Lake Munmorah Lake Loop; Budgewoi Lake Loop; Tuggerah Lake Loop; Brisbane Water Loop; Avoca Link; and Terrigal Link. Individual projects which form these loops and links are identified within the Central Coast Bike Plan. – Noted

2.2 Update on projects in budget - completed and planned

Presentation by Jay Spare, Unit Manager Roads and Drainage Infrastructure, providing an update on the status of pathway projects from the 2022/23 Delivery Program.

Projects in Racecourse Road, Central Coast Highway and Dane Drive Completed.
 Projects in Malinya Road, Tuggerawong Foreshore, Magenta (Wilfred Barret Drive), commenced or nearing commencement. – Noted

2.3 Update on grant funding received and pending for pathway projects

Presentation by Jeanette Williams, Unit Manager Engineering Services, providing an update on pathway projects which have received grant funding.

Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) Phase 1 and 2 – Malinya Road, Davistown; Central Coast Highway, Erina; Pacific Highway, Lake Munmorah; and Racecourse Road, Gosford have received grant funding.

Further grant funding opportunities for Mannering Park shared pathway; PAMP priority projects; Tuggerawong Shared Pathway; and Pozieres Avenue, Umina Beach are pending. – Noted

2.4 Update on opportunities to promote shared pathways

Presentation by Jeanette Williams, Unit Manager Engineering Services, on ways Council are promoting the shared pathways, including the recent Shared Pathway Inclusion Awareness Project. – Noted

2.5 General Business

John advised that Old Great North road, has been eroded and needs some repair work, he has a meeting with National Parks coming up to discuss.

Nigel made reference to the Terms of Reference – which talks about active transport not pathways as such. When the Terms of reference is due for review, consider including the 5 plans.

Enquiry on E-Scooter use – Council submitted a proposal to be considered as part of a recent NSW Government trial, however was not successful in obtaining grant funding to carry out the necessary Road Safety Audit requirements, therefore did not proceed with the trial. Council remains an interested party and will be advised on the outcome of trials within the select number of local government areas participating. Further opportunities to participate in a future trial will be considered.
