#### REPORTS

### 2.1 The History of Gosford Cenotaph - The history and significance of the Memorial

Gary Jackson provided a presentation to the Committee on the History of Gosford Cenotaph

Topics covered:

- No individual Local Heritage listing.
- The importance and meaning of the Gosford Cenotaph
- The history of the architect
- Government funding
- Maintenance
- Australian War Memorial register

Discussion and feedback received from the Committee following the presentation in relation to:

- The need for more budget/funding
- There will be opportunity in the future for an application to be made to list the Gosford Cenotaph with the Australian War Memorial register.
- The significance surrounding the Memorial in park and each memorial should be noted.
- State listing, there is a continuously changing number of listings.

#### ACTION: Research, what is the plan of action for the future of the park?

2.2 Aboriginal Grinding Grooves (being damaged by vehicle driving over)
Bradley Twynham 20 minutes
Damage being down to the grooves by water washing pebbles into the grooves and then cars driving over them.

Bradley Twynham led the discussion:

- · Some of the grinding grooves listed, are of cultural importance.
- After rain road got damaged.
- Due to damage to the road on the bridge, vehicles are not driving over the bridge, instead they are driving across the grinding grooves, which is causing them to erode, the road requires maintenance to stop this from happening.

ACTION: Council to follow up the repair to the road.

### 2.3 Heritage Tourism – Model Ships and a place for Heritage on the Central Coast

Peter Rea provided a presentation to the Committee on Heritage Tourism and need for a permanent place for Heritage on the Central Coast

Peter presented to the committee many diorama's that he has made including model ships reflecting the history of the Central Coast.

#### Topics covered:

- Seeking location for "History Central", currently considering a number of options including building 28 on mainland opposite Peat Island and a building at Gosford Racecourse.
- Seeking state funding for future community uses of the former Empire Bay Heritage Boat Shed site.

Adam Crouch - seeking funding to put platform to demarcate previous footprint of Empire Bay Heritage Boat Shed.

Peter has spoken to a number of community members who are interested in establishing Heritage Tourism on the Central Coast.

#### ACTION: Find out if there is synergy between what Peter is proposing

### 2.4 Errors in Wyong Thematic History and Consequences Potential wrong information presented in previous Wyong Thematic History.

Kay Williams led the discussion and provided an overview of her view of the Thematic History of Wyong and inaccuracies with the document.

Discussion occurred between Committee Members, with an agreement that any changes to the document should be undertaken in consultation with First Nations people.

Committee members to be advised of the consultation dates of the Thematic History and will have the opportunity to make a submission through this process.

A query was raised if the Central Coast First Nations Accord had been adopted by Council, it was confirmed that the document had been adopted by Council and a link to the document would be provided to the Committee Members.

Bradley Twynham led the discussion and provided an overview of the damage to the midden. RC advised she is aware of the issue and has contacted Council staff requesting and update on the project and rectification works to be undertaken. :

Want an update/list of past deferred heritage items, i.e. the Gosford Library

Gary Jackson led the discussion. Seeking opportunity for committee members to identify options for potential nominations. Committee members are encouraged to bring to committee meetings, any items they wish to be considered for Heritage Nomination. Explained we only amend LEP periodically but we could start compiling a list.

2.7 First Contact Sites that require Heritage Listing Kay Williams 20 minutes

a. Saratoga site/ Veteran Hall

Sites that should be heritage listed that convey an important, and as yet unrepresented, part of our local history.

Kay Williams led the discussion:

- Restoration of the hall no funding for heritage buildings
- First contact point heritage listing
- Armed people
- Massacre on the Central Coast
- Mount Pleasant is where a fight between aboriginals and white people took place and the Aboriginal people were buried where they were killed
- Human thigh bone was found. Believes it was washed down from a well.
- A grenade was also found.

Further investigation of the site requested by ground penetrating radar as believes this may have been a burial site from battle. As there may be unexploded ordinances, this would need

to be considered prior to any ground penetrating radar study.

Discussed limitations of ground penetrating radar study - i.e. soil affects results.

ACTION: KW to provide details of site. ACTION: Committee to discuss options

RC advised she has discussed with Fairview relative and they have requested an invitation to present to the committee and provide their thoughts to Committee.

## 2.4 SUPPORT FROM THE HERITAGE AND CULTURE ADVISORY COMMITEE FOR CENTRAL COAST COUNCIL IN CLEARING VEGETATION FROM THE STONE RETAINING WALLS AT PALERMO PARK

Peter Rea – 5 mins

Support from the Heritage and Culture Advisory Group for CCC clearing vegetation from the stone retaining walls at Palermo Park, where the Palermo Shipyard once operated and where during WWII 40 ft naval boats were built. CCC did clear this vegetation once before when on behalf of Rotary Kincumber, I coordinated the commemoration of the 75th Anniversary of the sinking of HMAS Patricia Cam, which was also built at the site in 1940. The site was also in operation as a shipyard long before this time.

Clearing the invasive growth would ensuring it is not damaging this heritage item, plus allow a proper full view of the archaeology.
