Recommendation

- 1. That the Committee approve the independent assessment of the Protection of the Environment Trust (POET) grant application Landcare Green Teams on Private Land (POET006 202223).
- 2. That the Committee request that following a review of Protection of the Environment Trust Grant Guidelines that a report on the recommended changes be prepared for the consideration.

Report purpose

To provide a status report on the recommendation made by the Protection of the Environment Trust on 14 December 2023 in relation to grant application POET006 202223 titled Landcare Green Teams on Private Land.

To recommend, as per advice from Council's Governance Team, that the grant application POET006 202223 be assessed by an experienced grant assessor who is not involved with the Protection of the Environment Trust Grant Program.

To recommend that the Protection of the Environment Trust Grant Guidelines be reviewed by Council staff in consultation with Council's Governance Team, and that a report on the proposed changes to the guidelines that provide greater clarity to both grant applicants and grant assessors be considered by the Trust Committee.

Executive Summary

At its meeting on 14 December 2023, the Protection of the Environment Trust Committee considered three grant applications including POET006 202223 from the Community Environment Network titled Landcare Green Teams on Private Land.

Two of the three community representatives on the Trust Committee declared an interest in the item and withdrew themselves from the meeting when grant application POET006 202223 was discussed. The Trust Committee recommended to defer consideration of the grant application and to seek advice from Council on the proposed expenditure of grant funds requested in application POET006 202223.

Advice received from Council's Government Team included that 'In fairness to all involved in the process it is strongly recommended that the committee engage an independent party to assess this grant application.'

This report recommends that grant application be assessed by an experienced grant assessor who is not involved with the Protection of the Environment Trust Grant Program.

A process for reviewing the grant guidelines, as recommended on 14 December 2023, is provided for consideration of the Trust Committee.

Background

At its meeting of 14 December 2023 in relation to agenda item 2.3 titled Grant Application POET 006 202223 Landcare Green Teams on Private Land, the Protection of the Environment Trust Committee recommended to Council that:

- 1. The Protection of the Environment Trust Committee deferred consideration of the Grant Application POET 006 202223 titled Landcare Green Teams on Private Land by the Community Environment Network (CEN).
- 2. The Protection of the Environment Trust seek advice from Council on the proposed expenditure of grant funds requested in application POET 006 202223.
- 3. The Protection of the Environment Trust review the grant guidelines to provide greater clarity for applicants and to better guide the Committee's assessment of grant applications.

Council resolved on 27 February 2024 in relation to the Protection of the Environment Trust's Agenda Item 2.3 of 14 December 2023

That Council:

39/24 Note that the Protection of the Environment Trust Committee considered Grant Application POET 006 202223 titled "Landcare Green Teams on Private Land" submitted by the Community Environment Network (CEN) and deferred making a recommendation pending further advice being sought from the applicant.

40/24 Note that the Protection of the Environment Trust grant guidelines are to be reviewed in consultation with the Committee to provide greater clarity for grant applicants and to better guide the Committee's assessment of grant applications.

Current Status

Advice on grant application POET006 202223 has been received from Council's Governance Team which includes that 'In fairness to all involved in the process it is strongly recommended that the committee engage an independent party to assess this grant application.'

A letter was sent to the applicant of application POET 006 202223 titled "Landcare Green Teams on Private Land" on 16 May 2024 seeking additional information about the application. A response letter was received from the Community Environment Network on 21 June 2024.

The Trust Committee recommended on 14 December 2023 to review the grant guidelines to provide greater clarity for applicants and to better guide the Committee's assessment of grant applications. This report recommends a process for undertaking that review.

Report

At its meeting on 14 December 2023 the Trust Committee considered three grant applications. Two of the three community representatives declared an interest in application POET006 20223 and removed themselves from the meeting while this application was considered.

The Trust Committee recommended to defer consideration of grant application POET006 20223, to request further information from the applicant, and to seek advice from Council on the proposed expenditure of grant funds requested in application.

Advice on grant application POET006 202223 has been received from Council's Governance Team which includes that 'In fairness to all involved in the process it is strongly recommended that the committee engage an independent party to assess this grant application.

A response was received to the questions asked of the applicant organisation, the Community Environment Network, on 21 June 2024.

It is recommended that as per advice from Council's Governance Team, that grant application POET006 202223 be assessed by an experienced grant assessor who is not involved with the Protection of the Environment Trust Grant Program. This may be a Council officer or someone external to Council.

It is also recommended that following a review of Protection of the Environment Trust Grant Guidelines by Council staff in consultation with Council's Government Team that a report with recommendations for changes to the guidelines that provide greater clarity to both grant applicants and grant assessors be considered by the Trust Committee.
