### **REPORTS**

### 2.1 Update on projects in budget - completed and planned

Presentation by Jeanette Williams, Unit Manager Engineering Services, providing an update on the status of pathway projects from the 203/24 Delivery Program.

Projects included Magenta Shared Path, North Entrance – underway. A number of shared path and footpath renewals including sections of Central Coast Highway, Erina; Terrigal Drive, Terrigal; Darren Smith Memorial Shared Path, Budgewoi; The Esplanade, Umina Beach; Craigie Avenue, Kanwal; and various footpath and kerb ramp projects – completed, scheduled and underway.

## 2.2 Update on grant funding received and pending for pathway projects

Presentation by Jeanette Williams, Unit Manager Engineering Services, providing an update on pathway projects which have received grant funding.

Grant funding opportunities for Mannering Park shared pathway; PAMP priority projects; Tuggerawong shared pathway stage 5; and Pozieres Avenue, Umina Beach pending.

Grant funding submissions under the NSW Get Active Program submitted for footpath/shared path in sections of Sparks Road, Woongarrah; Cape Three Points Road, Avoca Beach; Melbourne Avenue, Umina Beach; Brooke Avenue, Killarney Vale; and Sunrise Avenue, Halekulani. Outcome on grant funding submissions likely known by mid-2024.

- Pathway renewal program completed in full.
- Shared Path construction projects in Racecourse Road, Gosford and Wilfred Barret Drive, Magenta are ongoing and will continue into 24/25.
- Shared Path design projects in Malinya Road Saratoga, Tuggerawong Foreshore and Mannering Park Foreshore are ongoing.

# 24/25 Projects – as contained within the Operational Plan:

- \$5M Wilfred Barret Drive, Magenta Shared Path Completion
- \$0.2M Racecourse Road, Gosford Shared Path Completion
- \$1M Pathway Renewal Program
- \$0.8M The Esplanade, Ettalong Beach Shared Path Renewal
- \$0.3M Pozieres Avenue, Umina Beach Footpath Construction
- Ongoing shared path design projects in Malinya Road, Saratoga, Tuggerawong Foreshore and Mannering Park Foreshore
- New shared path design projects in Kurrawa Avenue, Point Clare and Avoca Drive, Avoca Beach
