3 Review of Grants

Larry Melican (Section Manager Natural Assets and Biodiversity) provided an update to the Committee on the number of grant applications received by the Protection of the Environment Trust over the past three years as requested by the Committee at the 5 October 2021 meeting.

The minutes of the Protection of the Environment Trust meeting on 25 February 2020 record in Item 10 – Funding Round for 2020 that:

Committee to trial a system of applications being open throughout the year (rather than a strict deadline). Advertising of the funding round be brought forward to commence in May 2020 and will remain open for a 12-month period.

Since the end of May 2020 applications to the grant program have been able to be made throughout the year, with grant applications being referred to a subsequent meeting of the Trust Committee for

their consideration. The 2020-21 grant round was open for a full year, with the current round 2021-22 having been open since 1 June 2021.

Table 1: The number of applications to the Protection of the Environment Trust Grants Program received, funded, not funded, withdrawn and pending between 2015-2016 and 2020-2021.

The number of grant applications has been consistently below ten in the six years of the program since 2015-2016, with three applications being received in half of those six years.

The 2017-2018 year is relatively high compared to the other years withing the six-year period between 2015-2016 and 2020-2021. Half of the applications received in 2017-2018 were however not funded.

The number of grant applications received during the 2020-2021 year, which is the only full year that grant applications could be made for the entire year, is not substantially different from the two preceding years.

The Committee discussed options moving forward including maintaining the current situation where applications can be made throughout the year, reverting to the pre-May 2020 situation where applications to the grant program are open for a six-week period each year, or the option of a different model.

Action:

a) The Committee agree to maintain the current situation where applications to the Protection of the Environment Trust Grant Program can be made throughout the financial year, and that applications are referred to a subsequent Trust Committee Meeting for consideration.
