COUNCILLOR LATELLA TABLED A SUBMISSION DATED 19 MAY 2008 FROM MR LAURIE EYES, A RESIDENT OF YARRAMALONG VALLEY, AND REQUESTED THE CONCERNS OUTLINED IN THIS SUBMISSION BE ADDRESSED AND REPORTED BACK TO HER BEFORE THE NEXT MEETING OF THE BOARD IN GOSFORD ON 20 AUGUST 2008.

RESOLVED unanimously on the motion of Councillor Rose and seconded by Mr Wilson:

That the Board note the information regarding the two pipelines proposed for the Mardi to Managrove Link Project, and recommend to the two Councils the following:

- 1 That, for both the Wyong River to Mardi Dam pipeline, and for Sectors 1 to 5 and 7 to 9 of the Mardi Dam to Mangrove Creek Dam pipeline, the recommended pipeline routes (as shown in Appendix B) be investigated and studied in detail, by carrying out detailed topographic surveys, geotechnical investigations, ecological and cultural surveys and other engineering investigations.
- That, for the routes nominated in recommendation 1, and subject to the studies in recommendation 1 not revealing conditions that would alter the recommended routes; work proceeds on easement acquisitions and the finalisation of pipeline pre-construction activities to allow the calling of tenders for construction of the two pipelines along those routes.
- That, for Sector 6 of the Mardi Dam to Mangrove Creek Dam pipeline, detailed investigations and studies be undertaken on all identified possible route options, (in both private property and along Yarramalong Rd,) and following these investigations a further report be presented to the August Board Meeting, recommending a route in Sector 6 for easement acquisitions and finalisation of pipeline pre-construction activities.
- 4 That the costs of making good any accelerated deterioration of Yarramalong Road, attributable to the construction of the pipelines, be allowed for in the project funding and shared between the two Councils on the same basis as other project costs.

NOTE: Should the recommended pipeline route be approved, a separate report scheduling the properties through which land easement acquisitions are proposed, would be submitted subsequently to Wyong Shire Council for its specific approval.

GENERAL BUSINESS

GB001 Request for Update from the Minister for Water and Utilities on the Central Coast Water Authority

Councillor Welham advised that there was none available as Council has not heard anything from the Minister for Water and Utilities, The Hon Nathan Rees, for some time. He also advised that Wyong Council has requested a meeting with the Minister and also a joint meeting including Gosford Council and this request was denied.

Councillor McFadyen also indicated that he had heard nothing further from the Minister.

Mr Wilson advised that, he had written to Wyong Council on this matter in order to arrange a meeting at the earliest possible time between the Mayors and General Managers of both Councils in order to overcome the perceived impasse that exists at the present time.

GB002 Could the TAG investigate and report back on the financial and water conservation impacts of increasing the internal rainwater tank rebate

Councillor Latella advised that the current rebate for retrofitting of water tanks to existing dwellings is very low whereas the actual costs on internal retrofitting can be from \$1,000 to \$5,000 and this could be the reason why the uptake is so low. She requested that the TAG team investigate and report on how much water savings could be made and how much of a financial burden this would be.

Mr Wilson advised that there is a report that already covers this issue (the Demand Reduction Activities Report) and suggested that this report could be amended to include the current data on uptake figures for water tank rebates.
