Minor Cracking of bitumen driveway



Angophora costata appears to be in good health and vigour with only minor deadwood present. Access to garage appears adequate. Removal of the tree will not significantly improve access to the garage unless additional work is also undertaken including removal of the timber retaining wall and re-alignment of the vehicle crossing.



Tree is 6 or 7 metres from the front of the garage (obscured by bay window)



Access directly into the garage is affected by placement of the vehicle crossing and the location of the tree.



Brick paving appears unaffected by tree roots.
