**Theme 1 - Population****Strategic Motion No: 1**

**Council:** Bayside City Council

**Motion**

That this National Assembly calls upon the Australian Government to develop a Population Policy that encompasses proposed sustainable population targets and the provision and maintenance of physical and social infrastructure and ecosystems necessary to sustain the health and wellbeing of local communities and conserve and respect Australia's unique biodiversity.

**Strategic Motion No: 2**

**Council:** Redland City

**Motion**

That this National General Assembly calls for the Australian Government to develop a formal process for consultation with the local government sector in the development of policy positions relating to population management in Australia.

**Motion No: 2.3**

**Council:** Kingston City Council

**Motion**

That the National General Assembly calls on the Australian Government to institute a comprehensive inquiry into Australia's population growth including but not limited to:

1. the extent to which current rates of growth have already or are likely in future to:
  - compromise environmental protection measures e.g. the Federal EPBC Act and Victoria's Net Gain policy for native vegetation;
  - make our capital cities less liveable by overloading our residential streets and suburbs with unacceptable, inappropriate and unsustainable development and



spreading unsustainable suburban sprawl onto urban fringes and into protected green wedges;

- Put pressure on our public parks and open spaces which are increasingly being commandeered for public events and residential and other developments;
- Overload a public transport system which has not been adequately resourced to meet existing needs;
- Increase car dependence by encouraging the spread of freeways and tollways that may not be needed if and when we pass peak oil and move to a carbon-constrained economy;
- Damage our heritage properties by creating pressure to lower standards and permit encroachments that would not have been entertained a decade ago;
- Increase unemployment and under-employment rates, particularly among younger and older age groups;
- Increase our carbon footprint by increasing the number of feet (i.e. the number of people living unsustainable Australian lifestyles) and by increasing the size and number of houses being built on the urban fringe;
- Increase the tax and rate burdens on existing citizens to pay for suburban sprawl development that requires heavier expenditure on infrastructure than infill development;
- Enrich property developers and given them an excessive level of power and leverage through political donations and other influence over different levels of government, thus damaging the integrity and purpose of State and local planning schemes;
- Assisted affluent and resourceful economic migrants far more than the world's 42 million refugees;
- Contribute to social strains and tension between communal groups and risk the harmony which we seek for our multicultural society;
- Put pressure on Australia's water and sustainable agriculture resources, thus making it harder for us to provide for our existing population or to maintain the health and productivity of our rivers and waterways; and
- Provided excuses ignoring the impact on greenhouse gas emissions of vast new development proposals.

2. Involve the community in developing a sustainable and acceptable population target with a strategy for stabilising our population, consumption of resources and greenhouse gas emissions while making a transition to a stable society that celebrates and builds on its democratic, multicultural heritage, equality of opportunity, democratic values, diversity, tolerance and vibrancy.

That this National General Assembly calls on the Australian Government to act in a timely manner to:

1. Formally acknowledge that population figures provided in *Australia to 2050: Future Challenges* are projections based on current policies and trends rather than firm targets;
2. Recognise that while some degree of growth is inevitable over the next few decades, both the pace of growth and the ultimate population size are within the government's power to influence;
3. Model a range of population growth rate scenarios (i.e. high, medium, low and zero);
4. Determine the costs, benefits and impacts of population growth and population stabilisation, address all factors contributing to growth, i.e. births, deaths, net immigration and factors that influence growth, i.e. economic incentives for reproduction, property speculation and investment; and
5. Calculate the impacts of the varying growth scenarios on Australia's economic, environmental and social systems.
