1. Overview

Financial Performance

At the time of preparing the Q4 report the financial results are still being finalised and are subject to audit.

The interim financial result for 2010/11 is a surplus of \$25.6m which is favourable to the adopted Q3 Budget of \$19.8m.

This result is due to additional grant income being received in the last quarter. These projects have commenced and where applicable are included as restricted carry-overs with works to be completed in the 2011/12 financial year.

The operating result before capital is a deficit of \$17.8m compared to the adopted Q3 Budget of \$17.9m, favourable \$0.1m.

Quarter Four Overview

At the time of preparing the report the Joint Water Equalisation with Gosford City Council had not been finalised and the final reviews are being completed for revenue and expense accruals, asset disposals, new grants, waste remediation costs, and contingencies and provisions.

Overall the financial performance of Council in the fourth quarter was in-line with the adopted budget, however there were some significant variations by line.

In addition to the bottom line result a number of carryovers have been identified where commitments for the expenditure already exist and no specific allocation or resources are available within the 2011/12 budget allocation.

Council's financial position shows \$1.9b net equity. The improved position is due to new assets in particular the Mardi to Mangrove Pipeline and a favorable revaluation of Council's property and infrastructure assets increased by \$73.9m.

The year end accounts will be audited in August-September by Council's external auditor and presented to Council on the 12 October for referral to audit, and for adoption with the audit report on the 26 October.

Service Performance

The Annual Plan 2010-11 contains twenty-two measures (KPIs) of these sixteen or 73% were achieved in 2010-11.

2. Highlights

Council joins sustainability program

Council has signed up to a special program to accelerate its transition to being a fully sustainable organisation.

The Sustainability Advantage Program, run by the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water NSW, will provide Council with access to specialist training and technical advice in critical areas of sustainability.

The program has a business focus. It will help Council to identify the financial value in becoming more sustainable and will help show decision-makers how Council can improve its operations through innovation, lower costs and improved productivity.

Community building upgrades completed

The upgrading of eight community infrastructure projects was completed as part of the Federally funded Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program (RLCIP).

Council received a Federal funding allocation of \$648,000 to upgrade facilities including: Tunkuwallin Hall at Gwandalan, Halekulani Hall, The Cottage at Bateau Bay, Myrtle Brush Hall at Berkeley Vale, Toukley Neighbourhood Centre, Colongra Bay Hall, Kulnura Hall and the Wyong Old School site.

Works included kitchen upgrades, disabled ramps, extended pathways, additional storage, replacement walls and floors and improved energy efficiency.

Youth Week

Youth Week activities were held between 1 to 10 April

2011 across the Wyong Shire, promoting the 2011 theme 'Own It'. Youth Week is a celebration of the positive contributions that young people offer to our community. It provides a unique showcase for their incredible skills and talents, their organisational abilities and their visions for our future.

Many events and activities received funding through a joint initiative from Wyong Shire Council and NSW Youth Week. Some of the highlights include:

- The GOATS (Going off at the Swamp) festival at San Remo was well attended again this year. This annual festival of music and activities designed by, and intended for, young people and their families continues to grow and is one of the largest events of its type in the country.
- Youth Factor was a series of events held throughout the secondary schools in the 2261 postcode area.
- Cynthia Street Neighbourhood Centre, in conjunction with local youth services hosted a Recycle Swap Party, an opportunity for young people to exchange their unwanted items.
- Own Your Wings was a day of activities and workshops for young women in our community, hosted by Warnervale Family and Community Centre.
- Oasis Youth Centre, based in Wyong, held a Youth in Leadership day.
- Youth Week activities concluded with the annual Skate, BMX & Scooter Competition, held at the Gravity Multi Purpose Facility at Lake Haven.

The Evening Commute takes out top photo prize

Sydney photographer, Annette Blattman, took out the main prize for her black and white study 'The Evening Commute' at the 11th Annual Wyong Acquisitive Photographic Prize and Exhibition.

This year's competition offered a total of \$2,500 in prize money. Entrants could submit up to three photos in the competition. There were prizes for first, second and third and five categories: Natural and Built Environment, Black and White, Abstract, People, Primary and High School.

The winning photographs were chosen from over 300 entries and were judged independently by the Australian Institute of Professional Photographers.

The photographs were on exhibition at The Entrance Gallery, within The Entrance Community Centre at the beginning of May.

Animal Care Facility provides valuable training

Recently Council's Animal Care Facility opened its doors to two Central Coast organisations which look after disadvantaged people.

Coastlink and Response Services Inc approached Council about giving their clients an experience working with animals, and Council was happy to oblige. Coastlink has been established on the Central Coast for 26 years and offers a variety of services to people with disabilities and people who are frail aged. Response Services Inc is a State Government funded service that offers transition to work and community participation programs for young adults with a disability.

This arrangement provides Council with an opportunity to not only help out those in need, but to show the valuable role of animals in our community. Some of the skills the participants learn include caring for animals, helping others, community responsibility, volunteering, self esteem, independence and communication while the pleasure that participants get out of attending the program is immense and they achieve some valuable work related goals.

New Precinct Committee

Wyong Shire officially welcomed a new community precinct committee with the establishment of a keen and committed group at Norah Head.

Bringing the total number of precinct committees in the Shire to thirteen, the precinct committees represent one of the most engaging ways for residents to participate in their local community.

Council Lifeguards win major awards

Council's Acting Lifeguard Supervisor Ian Vaughan was recently awarded the highest honour for his profession by his peers in the Australian Professional Ocean Lifeguard Association. At the recent National Lifeguard's Conference held at Bonny Hills near Port Macquarie, Mr Vaughan was judged as the Lifeguard of the Year. Ian won the award not only for his efforts in the Lifeguard industry, but for his commitment over more than 20 years to Wyong Shire Council, his efforts as a member of the Australian Standards Committee and on the NSW Water Safety Advisory Council.

Fellow Wyong Shire Lifeguard Stuart Sohier also walked away with an award, winning the Outstanding Service Award, to cap a big night for the two Council employees.

Both are very dedicated to serving the community and keeping our beaches safe and the example they set is why Council has a proud record of never having lost a life on a beach patrolled by our Lifeguards.

Estuary Management Federal Grant Approval

On Wednesday, 1 June 2011, Council signed off on the Federal Government's contract for the remaining \$11.34M from the \$20M Caring for our Country (CFoC) grant. The program addresses critical sites identified through the Tuggerah Lakes Estuary Management Plan (TLEMP) and was developed in close consultation with a wide range of stakeholders. The funding will allow Wyong Shire Council to complete extensive works and community education from June 2011 to 30 June 2013.

The works will include streambank rehabilitation and revegetation along many of the rivers, creeks and waterways in the Shire, protection and rehabilitation of wetlands and saltmarshes, extensive weed removal, environmental monitoring and improving land management practices.

The works and community education program will be undertaken in partnership with National Parks and Wildlife (NPW), the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) and the Catchment Management Authority (CMA).

Wyong Shire Council and the State Government are also contributing funding to the implementation of the TLEMP

and are designing and building stormwater pollution control devices, constructed wetlands and additional recreational foreshore facilities.

These works will be commenced immediately and completed by 30 June 2013, when the Caring for our Country program concludes.

A lasting benefit to the community

As part of the Mardi-Mangrove Link project, Wyong Shire Mayor Doug Eaton officially opened a new road bridge at Bunning Creek.

The new reinforced concrete bridge replaces the old timber bridge and is capable of withstanding two and a half times more weight than the previous bridge. The bridge is a lasting benefit to the Yarramalong Valley community.

There will now be unrestricted access for NSW Rural Fire Service trucks and water tankers when there is a bush fire. Residents and businesses will now find new development along Bunning Creek Road easier as housing frames, excavators and other large loads can cross the bridge. While Council can improve garbage collection services by increasing the size of the collection trucks.

The Mardi-Mangrove Link project is an initiative of Gosford City and Wyong Shire Councils with Australian Government funding of \$80.3 million through its Water Smart Program and an additional \$40 million combined from the two Councils.

New look Toukley Library

During May & June Toukley Library was refurbished and patrons will notice a number of new features.

The Library now features a program room for events and community meetings, new furniture, computers, carpet and lighting as well as a complete reorganisation of resources.

Toukley Library first opened in 1982 and has been delivering traditional library services to the community for the past 29 years. However, with technological changes and a stronger emphasis on

collaborative learning spaces, this refurbishment was timely and necessary.

The work was made possible courtesy of a grant from the State Library of New South Wales, to enable the library to be upgraded into a modern, fresh environment for the community.

The Library will continue to house an extensive collection of books, magazines, newspapers, DVDs, music and spoken word CDs to cater for patrons of all ages and abilities.

The Art House unveiled its brand



Wyong's proposed flagship arts centre has an eyecatching logo, thanks to the creativity of a local Norah Head resident. Almost 130 entries were received in a public competition to design a logo that visually represented the proposal and launched its brand. The centre's name was also selected after a public competition.

More than five years in planning, The Art House, Wyong Shire Performing Arts and Conference Centre, will include a 500 seat theatre, studio, gallery and meeting rooms on the site of the Wyong Memorial Hall.

The Art House will focus on performing arts and will also be a place to develop and show fine art, multimedia, dance, music and theatre, including national and international shows and exhibitions. At the same time, the centre will also be used for new ideas, learning, enterprise, sharing stories, socialising and networking.

Council has proposed that the cost of building The Art House be divided equally between itself and the Federal and NSW governments. Council has been lobbying the other levels of government to commit financially to the project.

3. Service Performance

Key Performance Measures

The 2010-11 Annual Plan identifies twenty-two performance measures against Council's Key issues which are reviewed and reported on a quarterly basis.

At the end of June, sixteen (or 73%) of these indicators met the 2010-11 targets identified in the Annual Plan, while six measures (or 27%) did not meet their target in 2010-11. The following performance measures did not meet their target in 2010-11:

Strategic Targets

The 2010-11 Annual Plan identifies 59 programs/projects to achieve Council's objectives.

At the end of June 44 (or 75%) of the 59 actions were achieved while 15 actions (or 25%) were not achieved.

Of the fifteen actions that were not completed one was due to Council resolution, three were due to factors outside of Council's control and eleven were due to factors within Council's control.

Actions Carried Over from 2009/10 Management Plan

Of the 12 actions from the 2009-10 Management Plan that were not completed, nine (75%) were incorporated into actions in the 2010-11 Annual Plan and three (25%) continue to be monitored in 2010-11. The status of three projects as at 30 June 2011 is summarised below.

4. Financial Report

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

Operating Result and Forecast

The overall Operating Result is a \$25.6m against Adopted Q3 budget \$19.9m. The operating result before capital income is \$17.8m against Adopted Q3 budget of \$17.9m.

Overall, the result is in-line with the Q3 projection however there were significant variations line by line.

Revenue:

Operating Revenue was favourable to budget by \$7.8m due to unbudgeted grant income received in the fourth quarter (predominantly due to timing in the delivery of Estuary Management Plan works) resulting a favourable variance of \$2.5m, \$0.9m higher than forecast fee income from s355 committees (offset by unbudgeted expenditure) and RTA. This is off-set by a reduction in User Charges Income \$1.3m mainly due to revised estimate of water unbilled water usage.

Expenses:

Operating Expenditure was unfavourable to budget by \$2.1m. The main variation was predominantly due to revised estimates of closed landfill remediation resulting in an unfavourable impact of \$9.0m. Partially offsetting this were favourable Employee Costs by \$3.3m. This was due to Service delivery Review, continued vacancies and lower than anticipated end of year revaluation of employee

reserves.

Operating Results and Forecast - by Fund

Overall results by fund are inline with budget, with Sewer showing a favourable variation of \$1.8m. General fund deficit of \$0.8m against a budgeted deficit of \$2.2m, whilst Water was unfavourable to budget by \$2.4m. The water variation was primarily due to lower than forecast water usage due to revised estimates for unbilled water.

CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

Expenditure to 30 June 2011 amounts to \$122.3m representing 81% of the full year Adopted Budget.

It is normal for major projects to be continued across financial years. Where this has occurred a request to carry forward the budget has been submitted. Requests for \$11.2m have been submitted for capital carry forwards, which are predominantly externally funded.

In addition to this, there was a significant under expenditure in the Mardi Suite of Works projects. This favourable variance to budget of \$4.7m was a result of construction contracts being less than originally estimated when the project was commenced in 2006/07.

Other works have not been proposed for carry over where the 2011/12 budget has the capacity to complete and/or the 2011/12 works program is at capacity.

PROPOSED BUDGET CARRY-OVERS

It is normal that Council activities, particularly construction, are rarely bound by arbitrary dates such as the end-of-year close off of the financial year. Expenditure incurred on such work may not match with the current year funding nor might funding approvals in the budget (completed months before year-end) reflect the work on a job still to be done.

In the first instance the expenditure is classified as Work in Progress and the second category is dealt with by carrying forward, funding approval already made by Council. This group is known as Carry-Overs and Council approval is required before staff can give effect to the actions, which effectively increase to the next Annual Plan budget – in this case for 2011/12 - or they displace other work planned in the original budget.

This category is also affected by commitments made – purchases or works – that may not have been anticipated at budget time.

These categories of end-of-year close off, are areas which can distort results and should be minimized wherever possible.

Working Capital

Available working capital (unrestricted cash and investment assets, together with the working capital fund) was \$15.8m at the start of the year. The working capital is subject to finalisation of restricted assets. This will be reported with the annual financial statements.

Cash and Investments

The value of investment securities and deposit accounts at 30 June was \$138.3m. Returns for end of the June quarter remain significantly over benchmark.

Capital gains on the Blackrock and Macquarie securities contributed significantly to this result. There was \$10.7m in debt repayments made in 2010/11. A \$26.0m loan was drawn down in June to fund water and sewerage capital works.

5. Other Activities

Material risks and liabilities

Risks

- The formation of the Central Coast Water Corporation and the signed Memorandum of Understanding sets out a phased program for the Wyong and Gosford Water Authorities to merge over the next five years. This merger will alter Council's resourcing strategy and our ability to absorb fixed corporate overheads. Wyong Shire and Gosford City Councils have formed a project team to manage and minimise residual risk. A project plan is currently being developed to work towards an accelerated operational date for the new Water Corporation on 1 July 2013.
- Construction projects (capital works) have inherent risks relating to latent conditions, scope
 definition, and allowable contract variations. In the works program there are a number of projects
 which by their size and scope have the potential for final costs to vary from original estimates.
 The finalisation of major projects including the Link Road and Mardi Mangrove Pipeline have
 contract variations yet to be finalised.
- DECCW Wyong prosecution for illegal dumping in the past is still pending for Toukley and Mardi.
- Final estimate of the remediation cost of Council's closed landfills is subject to final studies and design, and final construction estimates.

Liabilities

Significant provisions exist for:

- Future remediation of closed landfills which is a large future cost for Council and requires funding.
- Development Assessment Contributions In-Kind received in advance.
- Section 94 Contributions:
 - o Council has 'unfunded liabilities' in relation to Section 94 monies owed to developers for works undertaken by them and the gap between future capital works and Council's ability to collect funds to cover the cost of these works. In respect of credits owed to developers, the liability as at 30 June 2011 stands at \$14.1m. It should be noted that this liability does not fall due today, but is spread over a number of years.
 - Council's section 94 plans for Warnervale Town Centre have been negatively impacted by the State Government's capping of developer contributions. In respect of capital works for Warnervale this has resulted in a gap of over \$20m.
- Condition of Council's infrastructure and assets continues to have inherent future liabilities for renewal and maintenance.

Legal Matters and Expenditure

Wyong Shire Council is currently party to proceedings in a number of Courts. Those proceedings include the following:

- 1. **Environment Protection Authority of NSW v Wyong Shire Council.** These proceedings were heard by the Land and Environment Court of NSW on 17 December 2011. As part of that sentence hearing the parties requested that the Court make orders that have the effect that Council pay any fine imposed by the Court to the Tuggerah Lakes Reserve Trust, to contribute to the funding of the Bush Regeneration and Weed Removal Project at the Pioneer Dairy Wetlands (South Tacoma Rd Vegetation Corridor and Tuggerah Creek). The Court has not delivered its judgment nor sentenced Council.
- Stannic Securities Pty Ltd v Wyong Shire Council. These appeal proceedings in the Land and Environment Court of NSW are part-heard, and the hearing will resume on 17 and 18 October 2011.
- 3. The Dooralong Residents Action Group Pty Ltd v Wyong Shire Council & The Salvation Army (NSW) Property Trust are proceedings in the Land and Environment Court seeking to challenge the validity of a consent granted by Council to a development application concerning land at Dooralong. The proceedings are listed for hearing on 25, 26 and 29 August 2011.
- 4. Wyong Shire Council v Neumanns Contractors Pty Ltd. These long running proceedings before the Supreme Court are complex and arise from the contract between Council and Neumanns for construction works at Council's former landfill site at Bateau Bay. On 17 December 2010 the Court delivered an interim judgment and made orders to the effect that \$839,808.53 was to be paid to Council by Neumanns, which Council has now recovered. The balance of the pending claims and cross-claims were referred to an Assessor appointed by the Court, who has delivered his assessment of those claims. The proceedings are next before the court for directions on 23 September 2011.
- 5. **Neumanns Contractors Pty Ltd v Wyong Shire Council**. These proceedings before the Supreme Court are also complex and also arise from the contract between Council and Neumanns for construction works at Council's former landfill site at Bateau Bay. The proceedings are next before the court for directions on 7 October 2011.
- 6. **Wyong Shire Council v Environmental Land Clearing Contracting Pty Ltd**. These proceedings are before the District Court of NSW and concern a contractual dispute with Environmental Land Clearing Contracting concerning works at Gwandalan.
- Council is also the respondent to two appeals in the Local Court against declarations it has made declaring two dogs dangerous. Those appeals are first listed before the Local Court on 25 August 2011 and 15 September 2011 respectively.

A number of Court proceedings were concluded in the last quarter – those proceedings include the following:

- Wyong Shire Council v Jenbuild Pty Ltd. Those proceedings in the Supreme Court were settled
- **Percy v Wyong Shire Council**. These proceedings were resolved following a second s.34 conciliation conference by the issue of consent orders, which provide for the issue of conditional consent.
- **Wyong Shire Council v Balding**. These were defended criminal proceedings before the Local Court where the Defendant was alleged to have been the owner of an "attacking" dog. The court found the offence proven. The proceedings are now concluded.

Sponsorship and Funding arrangements

Details of activities undertaken by some of the organisations funded by Council is as follows:

The Entrance Town Centre Management

- Chinese Cultural Day attracted approximately a thousand people and was reported in Chinese and Sydney media.
- Promotion by Star 104.5 FM titled "not quite a Royal Wedding" attracted 3,000 -4,000 people.
- An information night for retailers and traders was held with over 50 retailers in attendance.
- In association with The Entrance Bowling Club the Town Centre has secured the 2012 State Bowls Championship, which is expected to bring over 200 contestants and 1,500 spectators to The Entrance.
- The Town Centre is also negotiating to secure the NSW Senior Triathlon Championships which will attract between 600- 1,000 contestants.

Greater Toukley Vision

 Conducted State Body Board Championships which resulted in over 150 contestants competing in the Championships. The event received significant media coverage both printed and visual. Local accommodation nodes were at capacity with most local businesses experiencing good trade.

Central Coast Tourism (CCTI)

- Since the engagement of an Events Manager, CCTI have been actively seeking events for the Central Coast. Examples include the submission of an EOI to conduct the Local Government and Shires Tourism Conference, the City verses Country Rugby League match and the Country Rugby Union Championships.
- Conducted the second Central Coast Events Alliance at Mingara.
- Continuing to participate with both Councils to develop a strategy as to how the region attracts events and the role of each partner.

Business Enterprise Centre

- The Federally funded Small Business Online program was completed with 689 participants representing 383 unique Central Coast Businesses improving their online presence.
- Naomi Simpson founder of Red Balloon was brought to the Central Coast during Micro Biz Week to host a breakfast, 63 local businesses attended.
- 8 educational workshops were held attracting 90 participants.
- 239 guidance sessions were undertaken with 159 businesses resulting in an estimated job creation of 155 people.
