 - a the land contains ecological and physical attributes consistent with the existing 7(a) Conservation zone and which are unsuitable to be included in zones that permit more intensive development outcomes;
 - b the rezoning of the land will adversely impact on the biodiversity of the locality as it would facilitate significant vegetation removal to establish access, services, construction and bushfire asset protection;
 - c the land has slopes of over 20% which are unsuitable for more intensive development.
 - d The applicant's intention to subdivide the site into 38 lots is inconsistent with the strategic intention of Council prior to the finalisation of the Environmental and Urban Edge Zone Review and the adoption of the Consolidated Central Coast Local Environmental Plan.

- f Inconsistency with the Central Coast Regional Plan 2036;
- g The planning proposal is inconsistent with State Environmental Planning Policy No 19 Bushland in Urban Areas due to the likely loss of trees within the proposed development.
- h Inconsistency with:
 - i) Cl(4) of Section 117(2) Ministerial Direction 2.1 (Environment Protection Zones);
 - ii) Cl(4)(5) and (6) of Section 117(2) Ministerial Direction 4.3 (Flood Prone Land); and
 - iii) Cl(4) of Section 117(2) Ministerial Direction 5.10 (Implementation of Regional Strategies);
- 278/17 That Council <u>consider</u> locational and planning requirements for aged housing as part of the Central Coast Comprehensive Local Environmental Plan project.
- 279/17 That Council <u>advise</u> the Joint Regional Planning Panel of Council's decision not to support the rezoning request.
